The Greater Cleveland Aquarium is filled with intriguing aquatic life from the Great Lakes and colorful sea creatures from around the globe. From moon jellyfish to a Giant Pacific Octopus, you'll discover more than 1,400 animals representing 250 species. Over the course of about 90 minutes you'll explore 50 exhibits—many with 360-degree views—ranging from rescued African Spurred Tortoises to an 11,000-gallon touch pool inhabited by Cownose, Southern and Atlantic stingrays. A 175-foot sea tube takes you to the ocean floor where you can watch barracuda, a Goliath grouper and four species of shark swim right overhead.

PLAYGROUND SAFETY TIPS

- * Check the equipment for sharp edges, exposed bolts, and areas they can get pinched (report any dangers to the parks department for repair).
- Check the slide and other equipment to make sure it is not hot before allowing your child to use the equipment.
- Make sure to keep your child away from the front/back of swings when in use.
- Help your child to take turns. One at a time on slides, swings, and other playground equipment.

FUN IN THE SUN SAFETY TIPS

The sun's rays are strongest between 10AM- 4PM.

- Whenever your child is outside (even on cloudy days) use sunscreen with a protection factor of no less than 15 and choose one that protects against UVA and UVB rays.
- * Reapply sunscreen every 2 hours and more often if swimming. Keep children under 1 out of the sun; sunscreen can be applied if your child is over 6 months old.
- Use hats to protect their heads from the sun.
- Sunglasses should provide 100% UV protection.
- Find shady areas too cool off.
- Be sure to offer lots of fluids (water is best) even if they are not thirsty.

Homemade Sidewalk Paint

Here's what you need...

- cornstarch
- water
- food coloring
- small containers (cupcake tins work great!)
- paint brushes

Here's what to do: In your small containers, add equal parts cornstarch and water (1/4 cup of each). Mix the cornstarch and water well (it'll be gloppy at the bottom). Add several drops of food coloring to each container to make the colors your children want and mix well. Then....Paint away! The paint will go on somewhat watery and dull, but will dry to a nice bright pastel. If your driveway (or other painting surface) is particularly smooth or bumpy, you might want to experiment with adding a little more or less cornstarch to get the coverage you want.

Summer Strawberry Salsa

Strawberry Salsa

- 1 lb fresh strawberries, chopped
- 2 whole kiwi, peeled and chopped
- ½ a lime, juiced

Baked Cinnamon Chips

- 14 tortilla s
- 1 teaspoon coconut oil melted
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon and 1 teaspoon sugar (mix)

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Wash and chop the fruit for the salsa, mix it together in a bowl, and add the lime juice. If it needs a little sweetness you can add a teaspoon of honey or pure maple syrup. Brush both sides of the tortillas with melted coconut oil.


Then stack them all together and cut into 8 triangles.


Arrange the triangles in a single layer on a cookie sheet lined with foil. Sprinkle each triangle lightly with the cinnamon mixture. Flip them over and sprinkle the other side too. Bake in the preheated oven for 8-12 minutes. Enjoy with your fresh salsal

BUBBLE FUN

Making homemade bubbles only involves a few ingredients which you probably already have on hand and provides hours of fun for everyone! Below are a few recipes that simply require a quick mix of the ingredients. The dishwashing soaps are specific as different ones have different "bubble making properties; however, you can use whatever you have on hand and make adjustments as necessary. Glycerin can be purchased at your local drugstore or pharmacy (Wal-Mart carries it too). Allowing the solution to sit overnight is suggested but not necessary it will work either way!

BUBBLE RECIPES:






• 1/2 cup of dishwashing liquid (Dawn or Joy), 2 cups of water, 2 teaspoons of sugar




June Book Picks...
