

Animal Actions






Don't miss last minute updates for playgroup. If you aren't part of the REMIND thread, join today by texting @23kk7ga to the number 81010.

FAMILY FAM LAUGS Look for Signs of Spring...

Try this easy family activity to get outside and explore. Take a short walk and look for signs of spring in the plants, birds, and animals all around you. You can do this in your neighborhood, at the park, or anywhere; including your own backyard. Need ideas to look for? Use the family scavenger hunt on the last page to search nature for items and talk with your child about what you see, hear, and smell. Touch things with your child to let them feel nature. 
Bunny Tail Trail Mix

Easter Sensory Bins

To make an Easter sensory bin, fill a plastic bin or Easter basket with Easter grass. Fill some plastic eggs with beans, jelly beans, rice, or anything you want just be sure to seal them with tape or glue to prevent your child from opening them. Put different things in each egg so your they can feel the different weights of the eggs and hear the different sounds they make.



Place the eggs in the basket hiding them in the Easter grass for your child to discover. Sensory bins provide opportunities for learning because children can explore different sights, textures, sounds, and even smells depending on what you use.

Bunny Color Hop Game

Items needed to play:

How to play...


To get started scatter colored eggs on the floor. If you have some pretend bunny ears you can give those to your child to wear and a basket to gather the eggs in. Now you are ready to play!

For toddlers, hold and say the egg color then have your child hop to pick up the correct color of egg(s) to put into their basket. For older children, you can just call out the color or add letters, numbers or shapes, etc... to the eggs for your child to find.



BOOKS TO READ...








Toddlers will giggle when the cow quacks and the duck meows. Luckily, the animals finally get their sounds right!

(make hole by cupping other hand)


When a noise he hears, he picks up his ears
